If you require a Fraser Health executive signature on a grant form as well (e.g., host institution signature on a grant signature page), please also include it in the full submission above.

<u>Allow five business days to obtain the VP signature</u>. The applicant will be contacted when the form is signed, signifying that the application may now be submitted to the funder.

Meaning of the Director (or Designate) and VP signatures

The signatures affirm that:
